GENERAL RULES & INFORMATION

The 30th Annual Skate St. Moritz will be held on September 10, 11 and 12, 2010 at Oakland Ice Center, 519 – 18th Street, Oakland, California and will be hosted by the St. Moritz Ice Skating Club. This competition is sanctioned by U.S. Figure Skating. There is no admission fee to view any event.

Schedule: It is intended that the Jump, Spin & Compulsory Moves events will take place on Friday. Other events may also begin on Friday, depending on the number of entries. Official Practice Ice will be available on Friday only. Some unofficial practice ice may be available Saturday & Sunday.

Rules: The Skate St. Moritz competition will be conducted in accordance with the rules of U.S. Figure Skating. This competition will be governed by all rules applicable to the 2010-11 competitive season except as noted in this Announcement. Rule numbers specified in this Announcement may be found in the 2010 U.S. Figure Skating Rulebook, which may be different in the 2011 Rulebook. We will adhere to any applicable rule changes instituted at the 2010 Governing Council.

The Chief Referee's interpretation of the rules and decisions on all questions not covered by these rules shall be final.

Eligibility to enter the Competition: Skaters must be current members of U.S. Figure Skating and have permission of their home club. Further eligibility is determined by test and age qualifications as per current U.S. Figure Skating rules, except as stated herein.

Skaters may skate at or up one test level in all events. Age and tests as of the closing date for entries, August 2, 2010, shall govern and be used to divide appropriate groups.

Groups: Two entries constitute an event. Solo entry events will be cancelled and the fees refunded. However, skaters who are the only entrant in an event may be allowed to compete if time permits, in which case fees will not be refunded. Exception: Special Needs/Adapted events which may have just one entry.

Events having a large number of entries will be divided into groups as appropriate. Group size may be larger or smaller than the standard set in the Rulebook at the discretion of the Chief Referee. Events will be divided into age groups for Pre-Juvenile and below and by draw for Juvenile and above. Basic Skating and Pixie events shall have no more than 4 skaters per group. There will not be final rounds for events with multiple groups.

Event Parameters: Juvenile and lower singles events shall consist of a Free Skating program only. Intermediate through Senior shall consist of the Short program and Free Skating program. The final combined result of the Short program and the Free Skating program will determine the final results.

Novice through Senior Pairs events will consist of both the Short program and the Free Skating program with the combined placement determining final results. Intermediate and lower Pairs events will consist of the Free Skating program only.

For Juvenile through Senior Dance (Couples), each component (i.e., FD, OD, Compulsory) will be a separate event and will not be combined. Couples may enter any or all components of any one level.

Skaters may enter only one level of any one discipline with the exception of Solo and Pro-Am/Am-Am Dance. Skaters may enter as many solo or Pro-Am/Am-Am dances as they are qualified and choose to enter.

Judges' Scoring Systems: The ISU Judging System (IJS) will be used for all Juvenile (not Open), Intermediate, Novice, Junior, Senior, Adult Gold and Masters Singles Free Skate, Pairs, and Dance (Couples) events. Skaters must submit a Planned Program Content sheet. All other events will be judged under the 6.0 system.

OFFICIALS

Judges and technical panel members shall be selected from the officials list provided by U.S. Figure Skating. Officials from other ISU member organizations may officiate as guest officials in accordance with U.S. Figure Skating rules, if available.

ENTRIES

Entries may have to be limited and will be accepted in the order received. Entry forms of partners for Dance and Pair events should be submitted together.

Online entry is available. Please go to our website www.stmoritzisc.org and click on the link to the Skate St. Moritz competition where you will be able to register your information and events as well as pay all entry fees. Deadline for online registration is midnight on **August 2, 2010**.

Or, you may enter by standard paper entry. Entry forms must be filled in **completely**. We recommend that you keep copies of all paperwork you send (including payment). Assumption of Risk and Waiver of Liability form must accompany entry form. Late Entries: All entries must be *submitted online or received* no later than **August 2, 2010**. Entries submitted online or received after this date are late entries, and at the discretion of the Competition Committee and Chief Referee may or may not be accepted. Late entries must be accompanied by a **late fee of \$30.00**. Late fee may be waived for good cause with the approval of the Registrar and Competition Committee.

Refund/Credit Policy: Fees will be refunded only if the entry is withdrawn prior to the close of entries, if the event is not held, or if the failure to compete is due to a death in the competitor's immediate family within two weeks of the competition.

If the competitor can demonstrate that failure to participate is due to a medical condition that is certified in writing on a physician or physical therapist's letterhead and states the injury will prevent the skater from competing safely, a credit toward next year's competition may be granted. Credit will be for a maximum of 50% of entry fees for all events except Special Needs / Adapted, which would receive full credit. Competitor's name will be entered in a credit ledger for the competition and they will be provided a credit slip to return with the following year's entry form. Notification of withdrawal must be made a minimum of 48 hours prior to the start of the event to be considered. Requests for injury credit will be reviewed and may be rejected for good cause.

All refund or injury credit requests must be in writing and received by the Registrar no later than 30 days after the Skate St. Moritz Competition (October 12, 2010).

SCHEDULE / GROUPS

A tentative schedule of events and an alphabetical list of groups will be available on the St. Moritz website (www.stmoritzisc.org). Schedule information will also be available through the Entry-eeze website. Please do **not** send a SASE for schedules/groups as they will not be sent to individuals. The skating order for each event shall be announced and posted at the arena a minimum of 12 hours prior to the start of the event.

It is left to the discretion of the Chief Referee as to order, time and day of each event. There are numerous factors to consider when setting the schedule including, but not limited to, skaters in multiple events and availability of officials. Skaters should be prepared to skate at any time that their event may be scheduled, including Friday. All events will conclude no later than 5:00 p.m. on Sunday.

Any schedule changes will be posted on the website prior to the competition and on the Official Bulletin Board or wall space so designated at the Oakland Ice Center at the start of the competition. Posted schedule supersedes any previously distributed schedules.

COACHES REGISTRATION / CREDENTIALS

In accordance with current rules, all coaches participating in this event must be registered with U.S. Figure Skating. For more information on the registration process, please visit www.usfigureskating.org. We will provide all registered coaches with a credential. Every coach in attendance will be required to check in at the registration table and must show a picture I.D. to receive their credential. We strongly recommend that you also bring any registration confirmation materials. Coaches must wear their badge at all times when coaching skaters at rink side of a sanctioned competition, including official practice ice. Monitors will be instructed to ensure that anyone standing rink side has their credential.

TECHNICAL PANEL CRITIQUES

Critiques from the technical panel will be available to those entering events using IJS scoring for a nominal fee. Skaters will be critiqued by a technical panel official. Critique location and times will be posted on the official bulletin board and will occur as soon as possible after the event concludes. Critique sign-ups must be made in advance and may need to be limited. Critiques will be accepted and assigned in the order received for each level. Sign-up is on the Entry Form.

REGISTRATION

A registration desk will be set up in the lobby of Oakland Ice Center on the dates of the competition one-hour prior to the first competition event. All entrants are required to register and be ready to skate at least 45 minutes prior to their scheduled event.

BULLETINS AND NOTICES

An Official Bulletin Board or wall space so designated will be maintained at the Oakland Ice Center and will contain official information only. Notices posted here are considered sufficient notice to all entrants. Check frequently for any change in the schedule or other notices.

ICE SURFACE

Oakland Ice Center is a dual-surface ice rink. The NHL Rink is 85' X 200' and the Olympic Rink is 100' X 200'. Both rinks have slightly rounded corners. *Both rinks will be used for the competition.*

MUSIC

Music will be reproduced from compact disc (*no CD/RW or DVD-R*). Music submission must be clearly marked with the entrant's name and event and is to be turned in at the time of registration or at least 45 minutes prior to the start of the event. There should be only one track per CD. *The CD turned in for competition should be free from scratches and smudges for the best result for playing your music and must be submitted in a paper sleeve.* Skaters are to have a back up CD readily available at rink side. Music should be picked up at the registration desk shortly following the conclusion of the event. The St. Moritz ISC is not responsible for music that is not picked up.

AWARDS

All skaters placing 1st, 2nd, 3rd and 4th will receive medals of gold, silver, bronze, and pewter, respectively. Skaters placing 1st will also receive trophies. Skaters who earn a special award by placing 1st (see below) will receive the special award trophy in lieu of the regular award trophy.

For Singles and Pairs events with Short and Free Skate programs, the final *combined* results will determine awards (i.e., no awards will be given for individual SP or FS placements in these events).

Special Awards:

IAN KNIGHT MEMORIAL TROPHY: Presented in memory of Ian Knight, former St. Moritz member, PSA instructor and choreographer. Awarded for excellence in presentation/choreography as demonstrated through the program components in the Junior Men or Ladies Free Skating (long program) events. The skater with the highest total Program Component score in the Junior Free Skate will receive the award.

KENNETH L. BROWN MEMORIAL TROPHY: Presented in memory of Kenneth L. Brown, U.S. Figure Skating past president and St. Moritz ISC past president. Awarded to the winner of the Novice Men's Free Skating event.

BONNICKSON/DAVENPORT MEMORIAL TROPHY: Presented in memory of Margaret Bonnickson, judge, and Frank Davenport, coach, both longtime and honorary members of the St. Moritz ISC as well as dedicated ice dancers. Awarded to the winner(s) of the Couples (standard, not Pro-Am/Am-Am) or Solo Dance in the highest-level competition dance event with more than one entrant. If there are Solo Dances at the same level and these are the highest dance events, the judging panel will determine which event will be awarded this trophy.

JEAN ROBINSON MEMORIAL TROPHY: Presented in memory of Jean Robinson, honorary St. Moritz ISC member, past president and ISU World judge. Awarded to the winner of the Senior Ladies' Free Skating event.

SUSAN WISE MEMORIAL TROPHY: Presented in memory of Susan Wise, former St. Moritz member, PSA instructor and choreographer. Awarded for excellence in artistry and choreography in the Pre-Juvenile Boys or Girls Free Skating events as determined by a special panel.

PARKING/PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION

Parking at the Oakland Ice Center is limited at all times, particularly on weekdays. Please consider the time needed to find parking when planning your arrival for your practice ice and your event. Skaters may be dropped off at the front entrance on 18th Street if necessary.

Recommended parking is in The Rotunda Garage, located on 17th Street. Parking is offered for a fee. There is an entrance to this garage on both 17th and 16th Streets. Parking is a flat fee of \$5.00 if you enter after 4:30PM, M-F, Sat. 7:00 AM - 12:00 AM or Sun. 8:30 AM - 6:30PM (no in and out privileges). At all other times the rate is \$2.00 per half hour with a daily maximum of \$16.00. There is a back entrance to the rink on 17th Street. There are limited metered parking spaces along the street on 17th, 18th and other surrounding streets. Meters have a 2-hour time limit and are in effect Monday through Saturday, 8:00 AM – 6:00 PM. Meters are free on Sundays.

There is additional parking located approximately 2-1/2 blocks from the rink on Clay and 15th Street, enter garage from Clay Street. There is minimal parking available on weekdays and a fee is charged. The garage is open 9:30 a.m. – 7:30 p.m. on Saturday and is free. The garage is not open on Sunday.

Bay Area Rapid Transit (BART) has a stop at 19th Street, which is a one-block walk to the rink. If you have access to the BART system, you may want to consider this as an option.

PRACTICE ICE

Official practice ice will be available on Friday, September 10, 2010 at the Oakland Ice Center. The cost is \$15 per skater per session and requests will be processed and prioritized in the order received. However, some consideration may be given to skaters from outside the area, traveling from a distance over 150 miles. Waiting lists will be established for full sessions.

Practice Ice fees will **not** be refunded unless the session is not assigned.

Practice Ice requests may be made online by August 2, 2010 when you register or separately (link at www.stmoritzisc.org). Or, entrants may use the paper entry form, which must be received by August 2, 2010.

Absolutely **no flash photography** is allowed of competitors on the ice. The flash may cause distraction leading to error or injury.

In accordance with U.S. Figure Skating rules, personal video taping is allowed of one's own skater **only** and only with handheld equipment.

BASIC SKATING (levels 1 through 5)

Groups will not be divided by gender except at the discretion of the Chief Referee, if appropriate. Groups will be divided by age when more than 4 are entered or when appropriate at the discretion of the Chief Referee.

PROGRESSIVE JUMPS EVENT (New this year)

ARTISTIC EVENTS

This event is to be skated as a rhythmic interpretation of the music selected. One mark will be awarded based on the competitor’s Skating Skills, Transitions, Performance/Execution, Choreography and Interpretation as defined in the U.S. Figure Skating Rulebook. Any jumps, spins, or footwork sequences incorporated into the program should be to enhance the above components. Base value and difficulty level of technical elements will not be a consideration in assigning the final mark. Novelty effects, such as lip synching or dancing in place, are not desirable. Costumes should be age appropriate and any decoration should be properly secured so as not to fall off and create a hazard for other skaters. Props are not allowed unless held by the competitor throughout the program.

Groups may be divided by age or draw, but will not be divided by gender except at the discretion of the Chief Referee. Groups for Basic Skating and Pixie Artistic are 4 maximum. Groups for Pre-Pre Artistic are 6 maximum. All others are a maximum of 10.

Warm-up groups are 6 maximum unless otherwise noted.

SPECIAL NEEDS / ADAPTED EVENT

This event was originated at the request of Olympic Champion Kristi Yamaguchi and her family.

Skaters in any Special Skater program of **any level, either singles or pairs** may enter. Skaters may perform with assistance (including assistive devices or coach assistance) or without. Vocal music is permitted. Only one entrant is necessary for an event. Groups may be created if appropriate. All skaters will receive an award. Program duration should be 1 to 1-1/2 minutes.
